What's been happening recently?

Once travel is feasible, Global Mission will organize in-person visits and exchanges. Meanwhile, however, our relationships have deepened and flourished:

In **Haiti**, we have continued to support the computerization of the church's head office. In addition, a recent \$10,000 grant is being used to acquire and distribute food throughout the various congregations. The ELH is growing in numbers and passion for the gospel.

A \$3,000 grant made to **Suriname** this spring supports the church's efforts to address gender-based violence. We will participate virtually in a symposium being organized this fall, as we learn about this issue together.

We are in daily contact with our companions in **Cuba** through social media. During this period of scarcity and stress, the church in Cuba embodies gospel hope as it ministers to the people. Efforts are being made to send a covid relief grant.

We have supported the seminary in **Jamaica** in upgrading its technological capabilities. Synod members participated this spring in one of UTCWI's new and exciting "short courses" offered virtually.

How is the ministry organized?

An 18-member Global Mission Table meets bimonthly to review the various relationships and make financial and strategic decisions.

Each companion is further supported by a "team" that focuses on one relationship in particular.
