8th Day Discipleship: A New Vision for Faith, Work and Economics

This workshop will focus on my book, Eighth-Day Discipleship: A New Vision for Faith, Work and Economics. In the book I outline an evangelical spirituality invested in people and their vocations as worker-priests. Daily life, work, and family will be underscored as the place where discipleship comes alive. I will draw on the historic architecture of eight-sided churches to call attention to an important but often overlooked emphasis on the eighth day of creation. This architecture points to the important role of economics in forming disciples. Luther's Small Catechism is reviewed as a major resource for this approach to spirituality. Rev. Creation Care as Faith Formation

This workshop is an adaptation of EcoAmerica's Blessed Tomorrow climate training. In addition to offering a basic review of the root causes of the climate crisis, and effective messaging and action strategies, this workshop will also offer biblical and theological reflections to deepen faith formation and integration in the care for creation. This will include reflections on the theme of gardens in the scriptures, the connection between the perfect harmony of the Trinity and the beauty of creation in the writings of St Gregory of Nazianzus, and how the climate crisis relates to the message of hope in the apocalyptic writings in the Bible. We must, as disciples of Jesus Christ, shift gears away from doom and gloom, connect with the deep hope for creation in the Gospel, and move with purpose on the greatest moral crisis of our age. Rev.
