- > All voting members must be wearing their badges and be in their seats in the Voting Members section in order to vote. The doors to the meeting room will be closed during elections.
- > Only information concerning nominees on official Biographical Data Forms developed and distributed by the Nominating Committee will be permitted at the Assembly. No use of special handouts or display area distribution concerning nominees will be permitted.
